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EDITORIAL

The trustees of Sarvodaya Samaj established Sarvodara Vidyalaya in 1969, which was the first private Gujarati Medium School in Chembur. To begin with, the School did not have its own building and was started with classrooms provided by **Swami Vivekananda School** at Chembur. Next year it was shifted to a building at 1'lth Road in Chembur and two years later to the Present premise in a huge building on a Land belonging to **Shri Pravinchandra Dwarkadas Dalal**.

Bhavna Trust was established in 1972 with a team of four enthusiastic, education loving and dynamic trustees Late Shri. Gagubhai Tokarshi' Chhadva, Shri. Keshavji Umarshi Chhadva, Shri. Pravinchandra Dwarkadas Dalal and Late Shri Mulji Khiyanshi Nisar. In 1973-74 Bhavna Trust took over the management of "**Sarvodaya Vidyalaya**" from Sarvodaya Samaj' As a first step, it Purchased the premises for the school. The trustees appealed to their friends for donations for the school building' Response was extremely good. In December 1974, the school building was started. Trustees gave personal attention to the building work with full dedication and self sacrifice' Essential facilities have been provided in the school. The staff, students and parents co-operated a lot and bore all hardships along with the trustees during the transit phase.

The school and College is managed through the school committee and college committee that keeps in mind the basic aims and objectives of the trust and follows department rules and regulations while running the school and college. Admissions

are given to all pupils making no distinctions of caste, creed and religion. Donations are not raised from the Pupils for admissions or any other purpose at any stages.

As time passed by, there was growing demand from Parents and well wishers for an English Medium School. In response to this, **Bhavna Trust** set up **Sarvodaya Vidyalaya** English Medium in 1980 with a K.G. Class. Thereafter every Year as a natural growth an additional standard was added in 1992, the first batch of English Medium students appeared for S.S.C. Exam.

'**Sarvodaya Vidyalaya**' began with hard days. With the support of staff, students (past and present) and well wishers, a paradise has been created at Sarvodaya Vidyalaya.

In 1991 Bhavna Trust has started computer classes to give knowledge of computer to all the students, from standard I to standard X for which an ultra modern computer laboratory was set up with 10 computers. Till today it is running successfully.

In the year 1997 Bhavna Trust obtained a permission to start Junior College of Science & Commerce, which was attached to our Mehta Sarvodaya Vidyalaya Gujarati Medium and it started Junior College of Commerce named Mehta Sarvodaya Junior College of Commerce. This college was started with a view that students who passed S.S.C. from our school need not go in other college and students can take admission in Junior College. This has helped our students a lot because students

of this school, do not have to run from one college to other for admission and do not have to pay any donation.

The ultimate aim of **Bhavna Trust** was to provide education to needy students from Junior KG to Degree. The aim was, a child who takes admission in Junior KG should complete his/her education up to graduation in one premises only. With a view **Bhavna Trust** obtained a permission to open a degree college of B.Sc. (Computer Science) and Degree College of Commerce in the year 2003. It started degree college of of B.Sc (IT) in the Year 2007 and college of B.M.S. in year 2008.

All the parents worry about their children's admission at 3 stages, Junior KG, after Passing S.S.C. in Junior College and after completing Junior College, admission in Degree college. Parents who have undergone the worries at these 3 stages know how difficult it is to get an admission at all the 3 stages. **Bhavna Trust** has come forward and established such a trust amongst parents that now they know that those days are over and they need not worry about the admission of their children. Bhavna Trust knows about the modern technology and by keeping in mind it has started Degree college in computer. Four ultra modern computer labs and AV Room (Audio Vishual) were set up to give better education to students. Library is opened for the students with all the required books available. Advance computer classes have also been opened and for recreation purpose sports gymkhana is also opened. (Bhavna Trust has opened College of Bachelor of Management Science in 2008). Ultra modern Physics, Chemistry & Biology

laboratories are set - up with all the required apparatus.

The college has full fledged security system to face any emergency situation and for the safety of the students and staff we have 72 CCTV cameras covering the entire college premises and class rooms. The college has fire alarms with well equipped fire extinguishers and other fire safety apparatus. The college follows Cashless transactions policy for the admission fees and other receipts as all the admissions from primary, secondary, junior and degree college are made online. The college also follows digital attendance system wherein the students attendance is recorded digitally in every class along with the teachers and periodically the attendance is analysed and after the generation of the defaulters list, the parents of the defaulting students are informed by way of SMS on their mobiles. The college has fully digitized classrooms with well equipped projectors, smartboards, audio visual systems and computers for the digital presentation of educational lessons and lectures.

Apart from the education we encourage other cultural activities in the college such as dance, dramas, music and other activities. To encourage poets and authors, we have started a magazine named **Bhavanankur**. We are sure that management with the help of the students will nourish the Ankur with love and affection that, the Ankur will grow and become such a big tree that it will give fruits, shelter and shadow to one and all.

INTER SCHOOL SCIENCE EXHIBITION 2018 REPORT

On 1st December 2018, the preparatory session for district level science exhibition was organized in the seminar hall of Bhavna trust degree college, Deonar. Reknown social activist Adv. YOU FEEL THE WAY YOU THINK!

People have to confront an extreme and diverse magnitude of challenges and pressures in life. They have to be on the frontline everyday to cope with high-intensity, extreme and negative experiences and yet manage to filter out the stress and expand their capacities channelizing these to healthy feelings and responses. Any experience, however catastrophic it may be, is perceived by people the way they construe, interpret and evaluate it. The external experience may not adversely affect individuals if the internal experience, their cognition, (their thinking) is rational and positive so will be the pattern of their feelings. The reason is that, it is not the situation, event or experience that defines an entity's feelings, but the perception or the beliefs towards the event that rules the affect of a person.

According to the Cognitive Behavior Therapy, given by Aaron Beck, our thoughts or beliefs about any activating event that triggers or generates a set of belief systems, influence our feelings or a stream of emotional, behavioral and physiological consequences. The activating event may be any external event, or experience including the reactions of other people, situations in life or an internal triggering event like a memory, image, meaning, a thought or a dream. It may cause a deluge of thoughts in an individual, or activate specific attitudes, demands, images, meanings, beliefs, and thinking which may develop a multitude of emotional, behavioral responses and physical sensations in a person. The way one thinks, defines their feelings and reactions, because you feel the way you think!

On encountering a negative situation, people find it complex to cope and adapt, hence experience negative, non-productive, automatic thoughts and end up possessing irrational, negative feelings that overpower their emotional well-being. Since situations of life, and sudden events are inevitable, they cannot be avoided, however, the automatic thoughts that flow speedily like a current in the mind, and have no control, can be disputed and altered with a rational comeback. Once altered, the outcome of the individual's affect would be positive, rational and logical springing up from the rationalized thoughts.

Positive events would lead to positive thoughts and attitudes thereby producing positive consequences (emotional, behavioral and physiological). The way you think would impact your feelings. Hence, if people are into negative irrational thinking, their feelings also become negative, leading to unhealthy responses.

People have become habituated to irrational thinking to a great extent. They tend to catastrophize minor events, personalize things, over-generalize and tend to engage in black and white thinking without reflecting, thinking clearly and logically. Their irrational beliefs flood their feelings and quality of living. They need to reevaluate, reinterpret, and modify their thoughts in order to experience a more positive outcome and quality of life. They need to reassess and make a reasonable choice of beliefs over the maladaptive ones and apply strategies that would alleviate such negative thoughts. They need to put their thoughts into perspective, be realistic and prepare to take risks.

One needs to celebrate complexities and understand that the world doesn't play to their rules and keep an open mind. Taking notice of one's own thoughts, moulding to the surrounding environment and learning to undergo extremities and bear the pain can improvise thoughts and thereby improving the way one feels. Better thoughts will lead to better feelings after all, since you feel the way you think!

What is the Internet of Things?

The Internet of Things, or IoT, refers to the billions of physical devices around the world that are now connected to the internet, collecting and sharing data. Thanks to cheap processors and wireless networks, it's possible to turn anything, from a pill to an aeroplane, into part of the IoT. This adds a level of digital intelligence to devices that would be otherwise dumb, enabling them to communicate without a human being involved, and merging the digital and physical worlds.

History of the Internet of Things

The idea of adding sensor and intelligence to basic objects was discussed throughout the 1980s and 1990s (and there are arguably some much earlier ancestors), but apart from some early projects -- including an internet-connected vending machine -- progress was slow simply because the technology wasn't ready.

Processors that were cheap and power-frugal enough to be all but disposable were required before it became cost-effective to connect up billions of devices. The adoption of RFID tags -- low-power chips that can communicate wirelessly - solved some of this issue, along with the increasing availability of broadband internet and cellular and wireless networking. The adoption of IPv6 -- which, among other things, should provide



enough IP addresses for every device the world (or indeed this galaxy) is ever likely to need - was also a necessary step for the IoT to scale. Kevin Ashton coined the phrase 'Internet of Things' in 1999, although it took at least another decade for the technology to catch up with the vision.

"The IoT integrates the interconnectedness of human culture - our 'things' - with the interconnectedness of our digital information system - 'the internet.' That's the IoT," Ashton.

Why is the Internet of Things important?

You might be surprised to learn how many things are connected to the Internet, and how much economic benefit we can derive from analyzing the resulting data streams. Here are some examples of the impact the IoT has on industries:

- Intelligent transport solutions speed up traffic flows, reduce fuel consumption, prioritize vehicle repair schedules and save lives.
- Data-driven systems are being built into the infrastructure of "smart cities," making it easier for municipalities to run waste management, law enforcement and other programs more efficiently.
- Smart electric grids more efficiently connect renewable resources, improve system reliability and charge customers based on smaller usage increments.

- Machine monitoring sensors diagnose and predict ending maintenance issues, near-term part stockouts, and even prioritize maintenance crew schedules for repair equipment and regional needs.

But also consider the IoT on a more personal level. Connected devices are making their way from business and industry to the mass market. Consider these possibilities:

You're low on milk. When you're on your way home from work, you get an alert from your refrigerator reminding you to stop by the store.

Your home security system, which already enables you to remotely control your locks and thermostats, can cool down your home and open your windows, based on your preferences.

Read the TDWI report, *Four Use Cases Show Real-World Impact of IoT*, to learn how the Internet of Things is changing how organizations work.

Who's using it?

1. Health Care

Many people have already adopted wearable devices to help monitor exercise, sleep and other health habits and these items are only scratching the surface of how IoT impacts health care. Patient monitoring devices, electronic records and other smart accessories can help save lives.

2. Manufacturing

This is one of the industries that benefits from IoT the most. Data-collecting sensors embedded in factory machinery or warehouse shelves can communicate problems or track resources in real time, making it easy to work more efficiently and keep costs down.

3. Retail

Both consumers and stores can benefit from IoT. Stores, for example, might use IoT for inventory tracking or security purposes. Consumers may end up with personalized shopping experiences through data collected by sensors or cameras.

4. Telecommunications

The telecommunications industry will be significantly impacted by the IoT since it will be charged with keeping all the data the IoT uses. Smart phones and other personal devices must be able to maintain a reliable connection to the Internet for the IoT to work effectively.

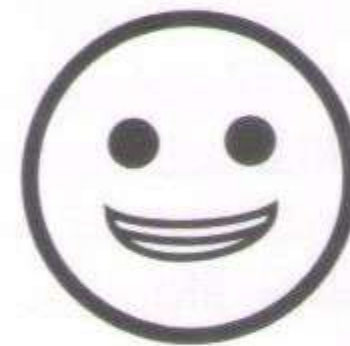

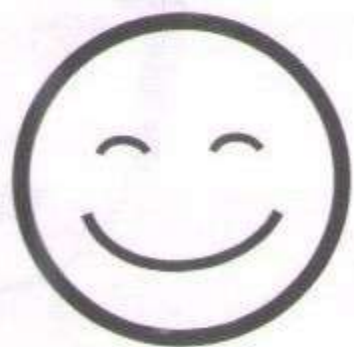
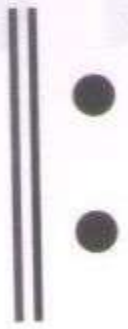

In the most general sense, the term space pollution includes both the natural micrometeoroid and man-made orbital debris components of the space environment; however, as "pollution" is generally considered to indicate a despoiling of the natural environment, space pollution here refers to only man-made orbital debris. Orbital debris poses a threat to both manned and unmanned spacecraft as well as the earth's inhabitants.

Environmental and Health Impacts

The effects of debris on other spacecraft range from surface abrasion due to repeated small-particle impact to a catastrophic fragmentation due to a collision with a large object. The relative velocities of orbital objects (10 kilometers per second [km/s] on average, but ranging from meters per second up to 15.5 km/s) allow even very small objects—such as a paint flake—to damage spacecraft components and surfaces. For example, a 3-millimeter (mm) aluminum particle traveling at 10 km/s is equivalent in energy to a bowling ball traveling at 60 miles per hour (or 27 m/s).

Remediation Strategies

Remediation takes two courses: protection and mitigation. Protection seeks to shield spacecraft and utilize intelligent design practices to minimize the effects of debris impact. Mitigation attempts to prevent debris from being created. Active mitigation techniques include collision avoidance between tracked and maneuverable objects and the intentional reentry of objects over the oceans. Passive techniques include venting residual fuels or pressurized vessels aboard rockets and spacecraft, retaining operational debris, and placing spacecraft into disposal orbits at the end of a mission. Space salvage or retrieval, while an option, is currently too expensive to employ on a regular basis.

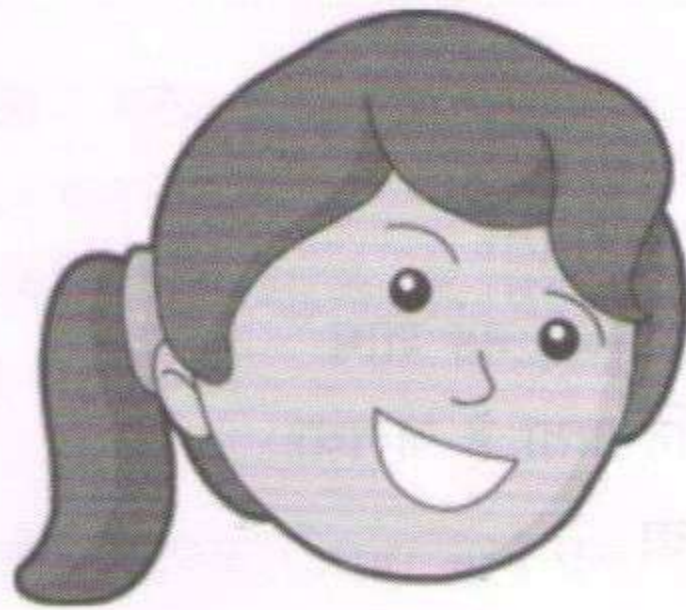

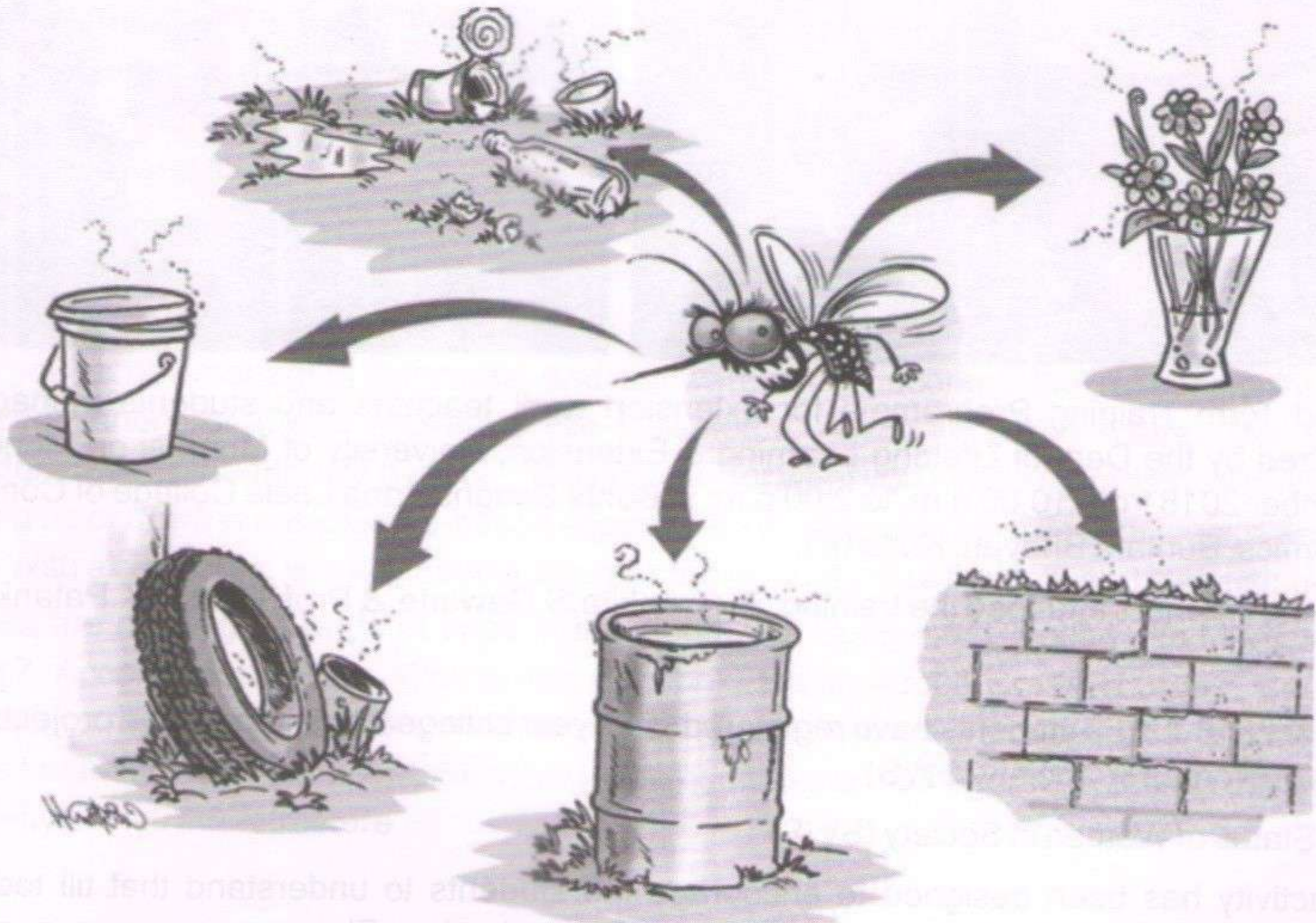
डेंगु

डेंगू बुखार डेंगू वायरस के कारण मच्छरो से होने वाला गंभीर संक्रमण है। उदाहरण के लिए दक्षिण पूर्व एशिया के कई देशों में डेंगू बुखार एक स्थानीय बीमारी है। डेंगू वायरस में चार अलग-अलग प्रकार (सीरोटाइप) शामिल हैं। जिनमें से प्रत्येक डेंगू बुखार और गंभीर डेंगू (जिसे डेंगू हेमोरेजिक बुखार भी कहा जाता है) का कारण बन सकता हो।

डेंगू बुखार के लक्षणों में तेज बुखार गंभीर सिरदर्द आँखों के पीछे दर्द, जोड़ों में दर्द, उल्टी शामिल है। कुछ लोगों में लक्षण नहीं दिख सकते हैं और कुछ में केवल जैसे हल्के लक्षण दिख सकते हैं। उदाहरण के लिए छोटे बच्चों में दानों के साथ हल्का गौर-विशिष्ट ज्वर (फेबराईल) की बीमारी हो सकती है।

(शुरुआत में लक्षणों में तेज बुखार शामिल होता है। जो २ से ७ दिनों तक रहता है। और ४० - ४१ डिग्री सेल्सियस तक तेज हो सकता है। इसके अलावा चेहरे पर लाली और डेंगू बुखार के अन्य गैर विशिष्ट लक्षण भी दिख सकते हैं। बंद में, गंभीर पेट दर्द लगातार उल्टी, तेजी से संस लेने, थकान, बेचैनी और खून बहने या मसूदे से खून जैसे चेतावनी के संकेत हो सकते हैं। गंभीर मामलों में, यह भीमारी सदमें और मौत के रूप में सामने आ सकता है।)

गंभीर रिश्ती में मरुज को अस्पताल में दाखल करने की जरूरत पडती है। हालांकि डेंगू की गंभीरता न होने की शांती में घर पर रह कर ही उपचार दिया जा सकता है और पीडित व्यक्ति को अस्पताल में अर्ती करने की जरूरत नहीं होती। इस रोग के रोगी को तरल पदार्थ का सेवन कराते रहें। जैसे सूप नींबू पानी और ज्यूस आदि। इस रोग में रोगी को कोई भी एंटीबयोटिक देने की आवश्यकता नहीं है। बुखार के आने पर रोगी को दौरासीटामॉल की टैब्लेट दें। ठंडे पानी की पही माथे पर रखें।) रोगी को यदि कही से रत्कस्राव हो रहा हो, तभी उसे प्लेटलेट्स चढाने की आवश्यकता होती है।

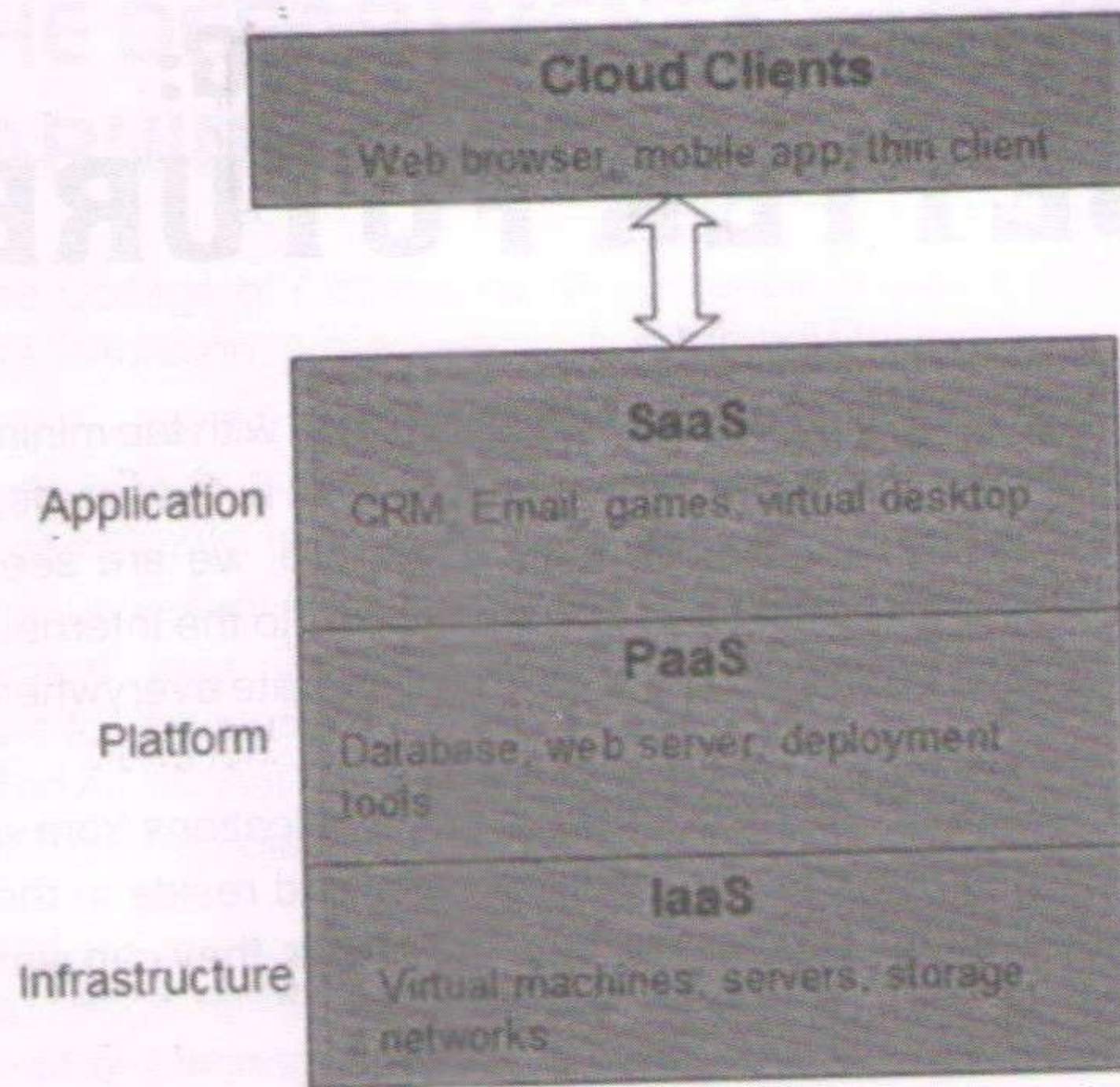
